



All-Color helped to sponsor Oregon Youth Basketball by purchasing shirts for several teams.


All-Color is All New



All-Color's exterior office area received a makeover with new siding, windows and landscaping. Two new colorful signs were added, providing the finishing touch the exterior needed. Having this new booth gives us flexibility to powder coat low volume jobs, while relieving some of the workload from our conveyor lines and large batch schedules.
